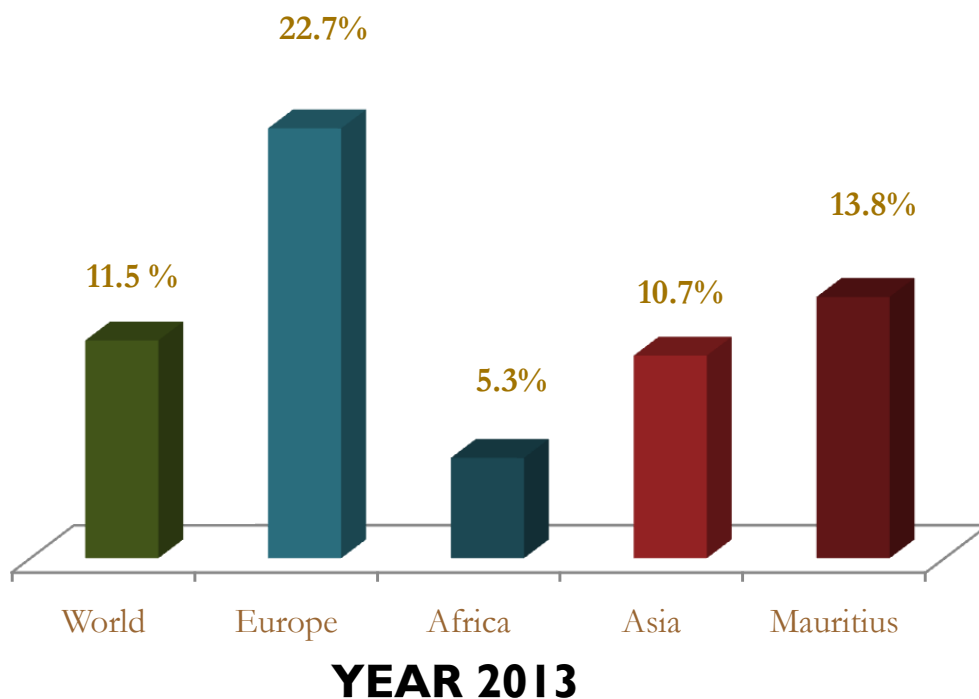

# FOREWORD

---

Mauritius is often taken as a benchmark for its success in population programme and provision of sexual and reproductive health services. A core function of the Ministry of Health and Quality of life is delivering a comprehensive sexual and reproductive services including family planning to its population, free of user cost, through a network of 1 Community Hospital, 5 Medi clinics, 20 Area Health Centres, 117 Community Health Centres at Primary Health Care Level.

The family planning programme has shifted its focus from achieving demographic targets to improving the reproductive health of the population, which is in line with the recommendations of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Plan of Action.

The Demographic/Evaluation Unit of the Ministry of Health and Quality of Life, which is responsible for monitoring and evaluating the national family planning programme, publishes the Family Planning and Demographic Yearbook. The present issue of this yearbook is the thirty-ninth volume and presents data on population trends, vital rates, family planning, and health service points for both Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues.

The family planning and demographic data presented in this yearbook has been obtained from different Departments of this Ministry, namely the Medi Clinics, Area/Community Health Centres, the Medical Statistics Section, the Medical Records Division and from Statistics Mauritius.

Data from the Mauritius Family Planning and Welfare Association and Action Familiale, which are two non-governmental organizations that provide family planning services, are also included in this yearbook.

This Family Planning and Demographic Yearbook is intended for planners, policy makers and the general public.

In presenting this yearbook, I would like to thank my staff and other organizations involved directly or indirectly to its compilation.

# **Analysis of Demographic & Reproductive Health Indicators**

This 2013 Yearbook is the thirty-ninth volume presenting demographic and family planning data for Island of Mauritius and for Island of Rodrigues. The 60 tables and 19 charts are grouped under the following headings: *population, vital statistics, family planning and health service points.*

## **Island of Mauritius**

### **Age structure of the population**

Table A.1 shows the population distribution of the Island of Mauritius at census dates. The average annual population growth rate was 0.42% during the intercensal period of 2000-2011: The censuses enumerated 1,196,383 inhabitants in 2011 compared to 1,143,069 inhabitants in 2000. In 2011, the sex ratio was 976 males per 1000 females.

Table A.2 shows the estimated mid-year resident population according to age group and sex in 2012 and 2013. The figures show that between 2012 and 2013 the proportion of population aged under 15 has decreased slightly from 20.9% to 20.4% and the proportion of the elderly population (aged 60 and above) has increased from 13.1% to 13.8%. Moreover, the median age of the population, the age at which 50% of the population is older and 50% is younger than that age, has increased from 34.0 years in 2012 to 34.4 years in 2013.

Table A.8 summarises the changes in the age structure of the Mauritian population from 1962 to 2053. The total size of the medium variant projected population is estimated to decline by 17.6% between 2013 and 2053. The proportion of people aged under 15 will decline from 20.4% in 2013 to 11.3% in 2053 and the proportion of people aged 60 and above will increase from 13.8% in 2012 to 34.3% in 2053. In absolute numbers, the elderly population will increase from 167,466 in 2013 to 343,916 in 2053, thus exhibiting an increase of slightly above twofold.

Chart 4 portrays the age-sex profiles of the population of Island of Mauritius. In 1962, there were larger percentages of the population in the younger age group as shown by the expansive population pyramid compared with the one in 2013. In 2053, the population pyramid shows larger percentages of the population in the older age group. Table A.8 shows that the median age of the population is projected to increase from 34.4 years in 2013 to 53.6 years in 2053.

Life expectancy at birth has improved considerably over the years. Table B.8 shows that life expectancy at birth was 77.69 years for females and 70.59 years for males in 2012. By 2053, life expectancy at birth is projected to be 80.80 years for females and 75.88 years for males (Table A.7).

Table B.1 indicates that the population growth rate in 2013 was 0.16% and if this rate is maintained annually, it will take about 437 years for the 2013 population to double in size.

## **Vital Rates**

The last three decades has been characterised by a cyclical trend in the crude birth rate: a steady decline from 22.1 in 1982 to 18.3 in 1986 and after an increase from 19.1 in 1987 to 21.1 in 1992, the crude birth rate decreased steadily to 10.7 in 2013. Moreover, the average crude birth rate in the last 5-year period has declined

compared with the preceding 5-year period, from 14.2 for the period of 2004-2008 to 11.5 for the period of 2009-13.

The crude death rate was 7.6 in 2013. In fact, the crude death rate has fluctuated between 6.5 and 7.6 during the last 30 years, i.e 1983-2013.

There have been significant improvements in the survival of infants over the past three decades. The infant mortality rate has decreased from 25.6 in 1983 to 12.2 in 2013 showing a decrease of 52.2%. Moreover, the average infant mortality rate in the last 5-year period has declined compared to the preceding 5-year period from 14.1 for the period of 2004-2008 to 12.8 for the period 2009-2013.

The under-five mortality rate is a leading indicator of child health and overall human development and it is indicative of government commitment to health. Figures show that the under-five mortality rate has decreased from 32.0 in 1983 to 14.6 on 2013 showing a decrease of 54.4%.

Table B.3 shows that the still birth rate has dropped from 18.6 in 1983 to 8.7 in 2013.

From 1991 to 2011, the maternal mortality rate dropped from 0.7 maternal death per 1000 live births to 0.36 (36 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births). The maternal mortality rate was 0.65 in 2012 and 0.69 in 2013.

The perinatal mortality rate has declined from 32.7 in 1983 to 14.8 in 2013 representing a decrease of 54.7%.

The early neonatal mortality rate dropped from 14.3 in 1983 to 6.2 in 2013, thus indicating a decrease of 56.6%. It should be noted that early neonatal deaths contributed to about 50% of all infant deaths in 2013.

## **Vital rates by geographical distribution**

Tables B.4 to B.7 show the trends in vital rates by district in 1972, 1983, 1990, 2000 and from 2006 to 2013. Black River had the highest crude birth rate (13.3) in 2013, while Riviere du Rempart had the lowest crude birth rate (9.6). Overall, three districts had higher crude birth rates than the national level of 10.7.

In 2013, Port Louis had the highest crude death rate (9.3) and Flacq had the lowest crude death rate (6.4). Overall, three districts had higher crude death rates than the national level of 7.6.

In 2013, Moka had the lowest still birth rate (6.2) and Riviere du Rempart had the highest still birth rate (11.5). Overall, five districts had higher still birth rates than the national level of 8.7.

In 2013, Flacq had the lowest infant mortality rate (8.3) and Riviere du Rempart had the highest infant mortality rate (16.5). Five districts had higher infant mortality rates than the national level of 12.2.

## **Fertility Rates**

Tables B.9 to B.12 show the trends in fertility rates. There has been a downward shift in the general fertility rate from 181.4 in 1962 to 59.44 in 2000 and a further decrease to reach 40.46 in 2013.

The total fertility rate decreased from 5.86 in 1962 to 1.94 in 1986, but increased to 1.97 in 2000. Thereafter, the total fertility rate showed a significant decrease to reach 1.41 in 2013, which was the lowest rate ever recorded in the Island of Mauritius. Hence, Island of Mauritius continues to experience below replacement fertility level (replacement level equals to 2.1 children per woman).

The net reproduction rate decreased from 2.51 in 1962 to 0.90 in 1986 but increased to 0.93 in 2000. In 2013, the net reproduction rate was 0.68, which was the lowest rate ever recorded in the Island of Mauritius.

Table B.9a shows that between 2006 to 2013, the fertility rates declined in all the five-year age groups except in the age group 30-34. In 2013, the age-specific fertility rates showed that women aged 25-29 had the highest fertility rate (87.9) followed by women aged 20-24 (68.8). It is noted that between 2012 and 2013, there has been a significant decrease in fertility among all 5-year age groups, except in the age group 40-44 years.

Adolescent fertility rate (age group 15-19) decreased from 32.4 in 2006 to 25.7 in 2013, thus showing a decrease of 20.7%. In 2013, there were 28 live births pertaining to mothers aged under 15 years.

In 2013, there were 2,094 births of third and higher orders, which accounted for 16.4% of the 12,789 total live births occurred in the Island of Mauritius. Table B.11 shows that 9.5% of the total live births were to mothers aged under 20 years, thus representing 1,210 live births of which 20 were of third and higher orders.

The censuses reveal that the mean age of childbearing has increased from 26.3 years in 1983 to 26.9 years in 2000 and to 27.5 in 2011.

## **Nuptiality**

Postponement of marriage has played a crucial role in fertility reduction in Mauritius as revealed by censuses data. Table A.4 shows that the proportion of currently married women in the age group 15-19 has declined from 27.80% in 1962 to 10.50% in 1983 and 6.24% in 2011.

Chart 9 shows a downward trend in the marriage rate from 21.4 in 1993 to 15.4 in 2013. In 2013, 9,393 marriages were registered in the Island of Mauritius.

The 2011 census figures show that the singulate mean age at marriage was 29.0 years for males and 23.9 years for females.

In 2013, 1,584 divorces were granted in the Republic of Mauritius compared with 2,003 in 2012 and 65.4% of all couples granted divorce in 2013 had at least one dependent child. Chart 10 shows that the divorce rate was 2.5 in 2013 for the Republic of Mauritius.

## **Family Planning**

### **New Acceptors**

In 2013, there were a total of 5,720 new acceptors in the Island of Mauritius at Government Family Planning Clinics, Mauritius Family Planning & Welfare Association (MFPWA) and Action Familiale (A.F.). This total also includes 519 new acceptors of tubal ligation reported at Government hospitals. Pill was the most preferred method among new acceptors accounting for 26.6% followed by male condom (22.0%), sympto-thermal (21.9%), 3-month injectable (15.0%), tubal ligation (9.1%), monthly injectable (3.2%), intra-uterine device (1.3%) and implant (0.9%).

### **Current Users**

Table C.10 shows that there were a total of 67,422 current users as at 31st December 2013 in the Island of Mauritius at Government Family Planning Clinics, A.F. and MFPWA. This total also includes the 13,116 clients who have undergone tubal ligation, but were registered at Government hospitals. Among the total current users, 42.21% were on sympto-thermal, 21.73% were on tubal ligation, 12.49% were on pill, 12.19% were on male condom, 5.15% were on 3-month injectable, 3.32% were on intra-uterine device, 2.05% were on implant and 0.83% on monthly injectable.



The service statistics of Government and NGOs show that 21.3% of women in the reproductive age group and 34.8% of married women in the reproductive age group were contraceptive users in 2013.

### **Family Planning Service Points**

The Ministry of Health and Quality of Life has established 5 operational health regions covering the whole Island of Mauritius and within each health region, there are service points that provide family planning services and information. Presently, there are 166 service points throughout Island of Mauritius: 1 Community Hospital, 5 Medi-Clinics, 20 Area Health Centres, 117 Community Health Centres, 3 Family Health Clinics, 2 Family Planning Clinics, 1 Family Planning Supply Centre and 17 Industrial Family Planning Supply Centres. Moreover, about 1,904 women in the reproductive age group are served per point.

Table E.3 shows that there was an attendance of 80,134 family planning clients at the service points for the Island of Mauritius in 2013.

In 2013, 9 family planning clinics provided services after working hours, on Sundays and on public holidays.

## **Island of Rodrigues**

Tables F.1 to F.6 show vital rates and family planning statistics in Rodrigues. In the past three decades, the crude birth rate dropped significantly from 34.7 in 1983 to 17.0 in 2013.

Fertility levels in Rodrigues, also measured by the total fertility rate, have declined from 5.16 in 1983 to 2.17 in 2013.

In 2013, women in the age group 25-29 had the highest fertility rate (104.4) followed by women aged 20-24 (92.1). The adolescent fertility rate (age group 15-19) was 64.7.

Rodrigues has witnessed remarkable improvement in the survival of infants. The infant mortality rate dropped from 51.6 in 1983 to 8.5 in 2013, which was the lowest figure ever recorded in the island of Rodrigues.

The still birth rate dropped from 17.1 in 1983 to 4.3 in 2013, thus representing a decrease of 78.4%.

In 2013, 415 new acceptors were recorded in the family planning clinics in Rodrigues: 163 were on pill, 124 were on 3-month injectable, 45 were on sympto-thermal, 42 on tubal ligation, 32 were on implant, 7 were on male condom, and 2 were on intra-uterine device.

By the 31st of December 2013, 5,749 current users were recorded in the family planning clinics: 38.9% were on pill, 23.7% were on sympto-thermal, 16.4% were on 3-month injectable, 9.2% were on male condom, 4.9% were on tubal ligation, 4.5% on implant and 2.3 % were on intra-uterine device.

The service statistics of Government and NGOs show that 53.6% of women in the reproductive age group were contraceptive users in 2013.

### **Family Planning Service Points**

In 2013, there were 17 family planning service points in the Island of Rodrigues and about 630 females in the reproductive age group were served per point.

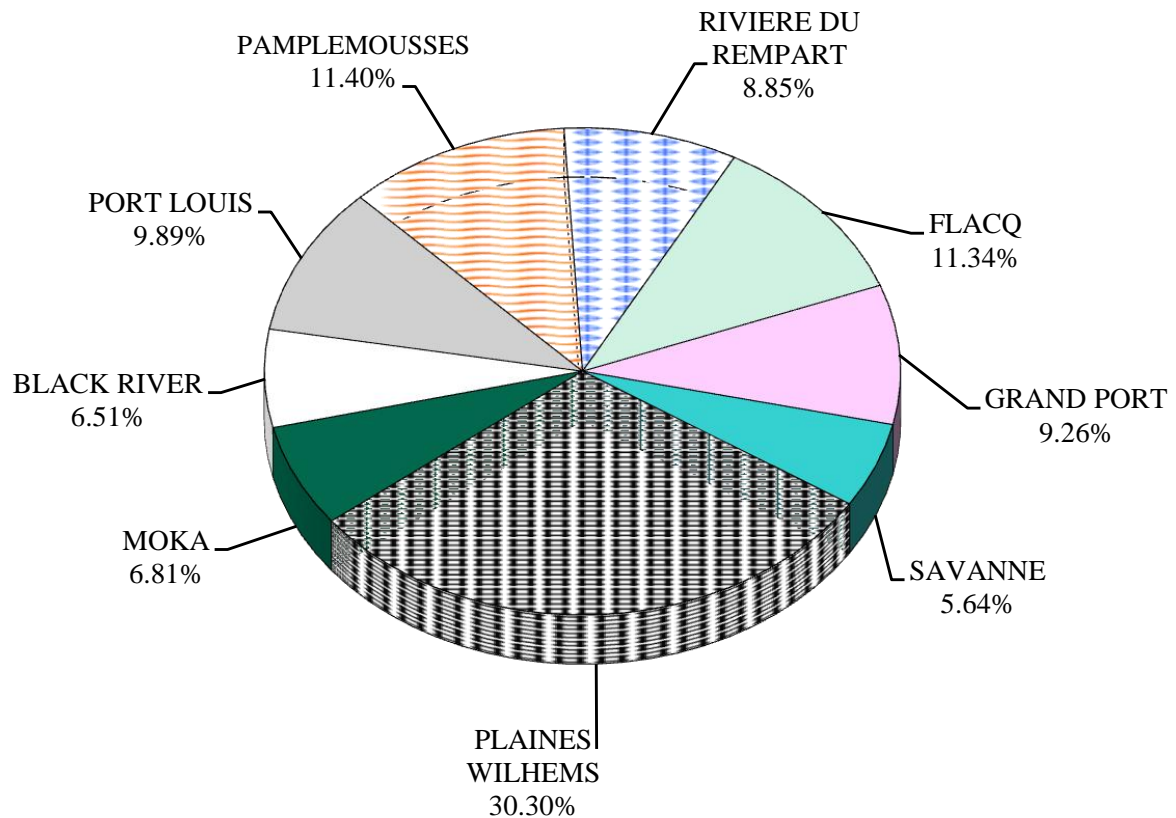

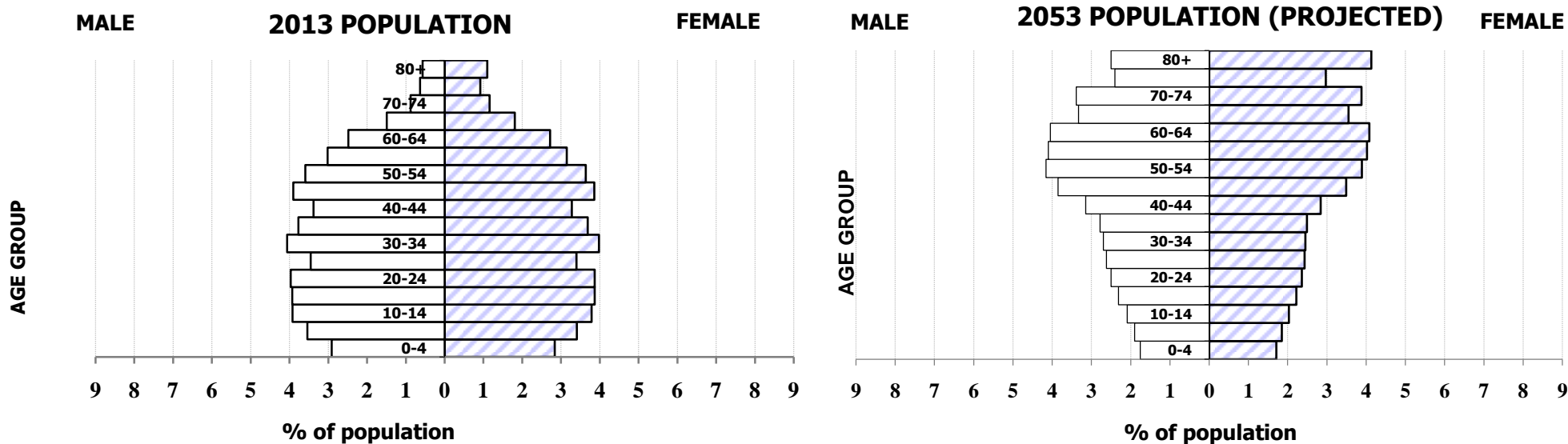

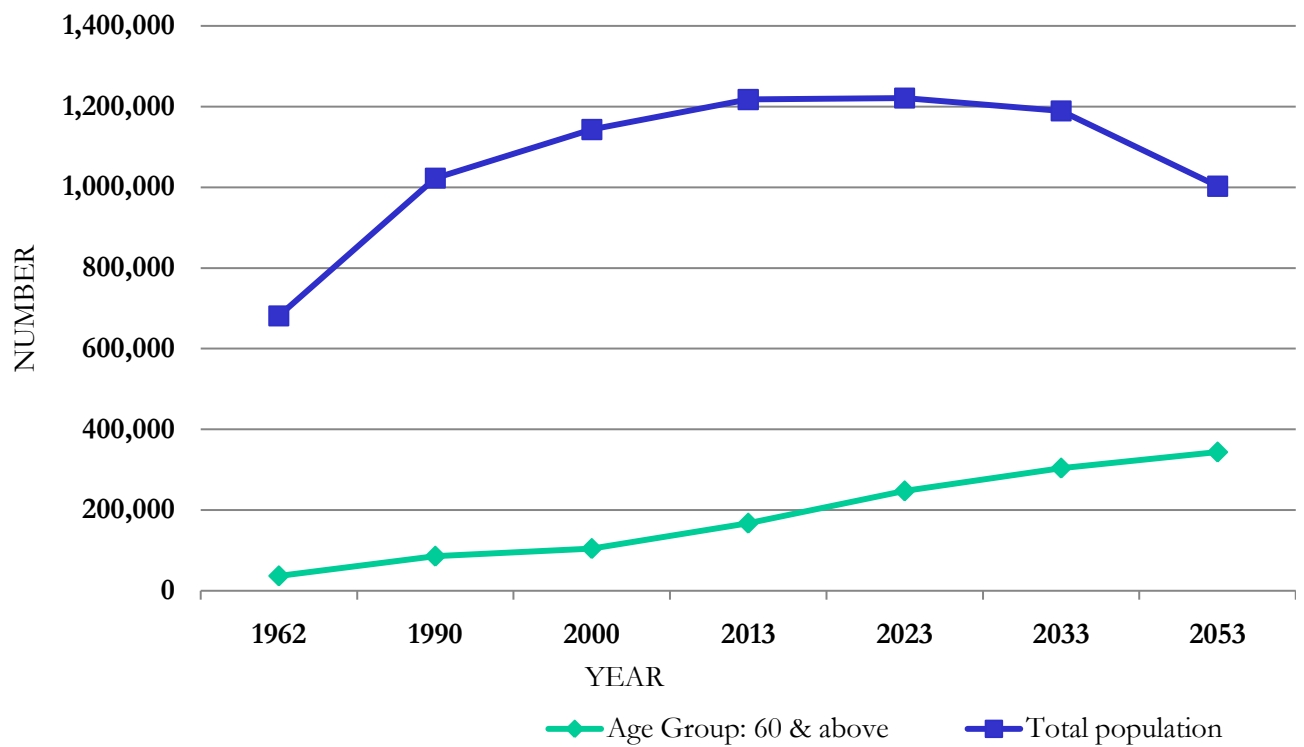

EVOLUTION OF TOTAL POPULATION AND POPULATION AGED 60 YEARS AND ABOVE 1962 - 2053

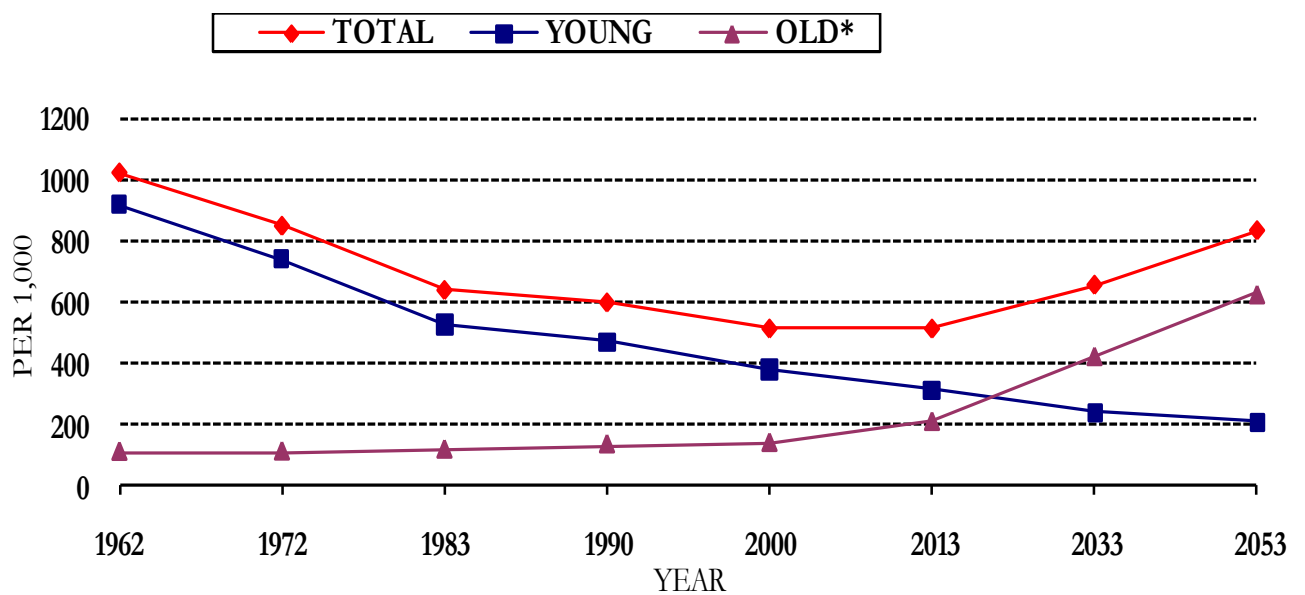

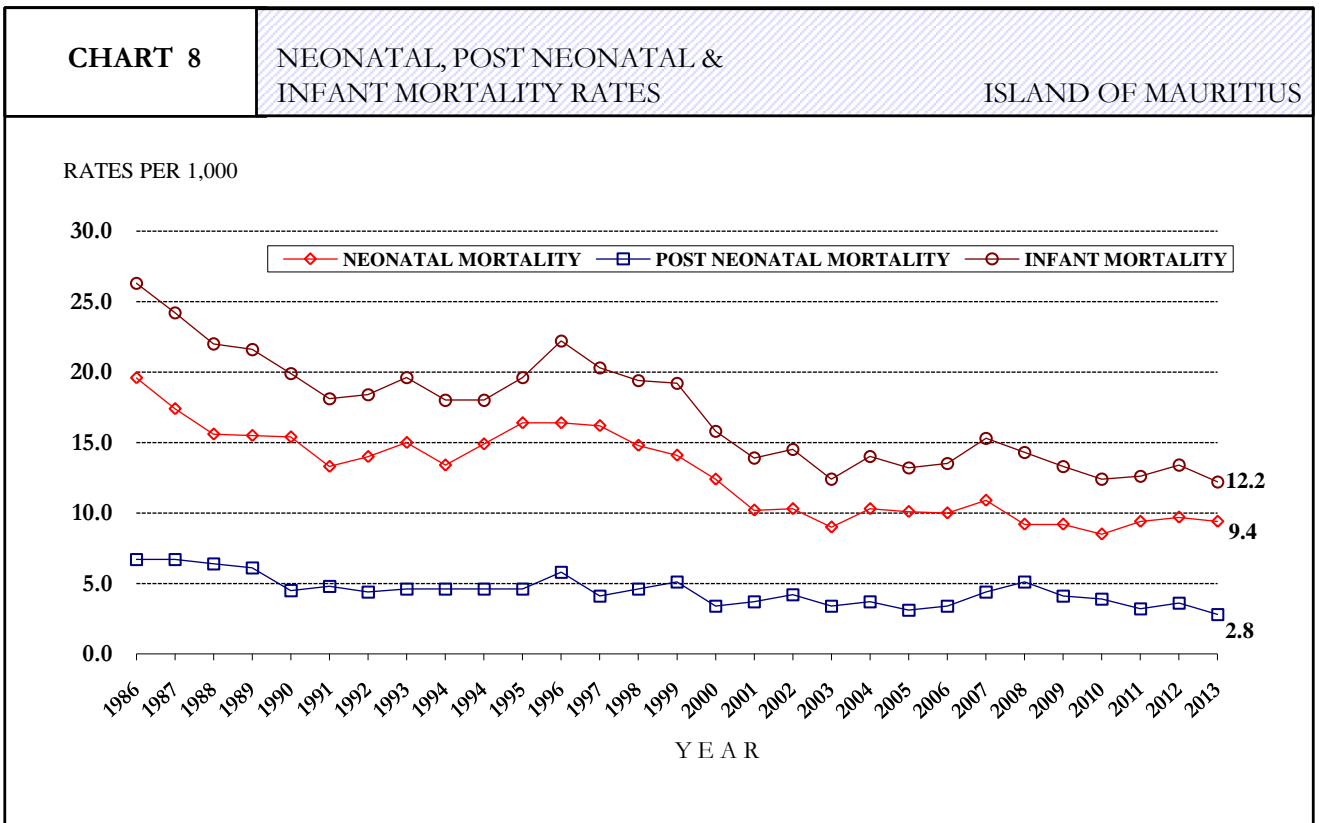
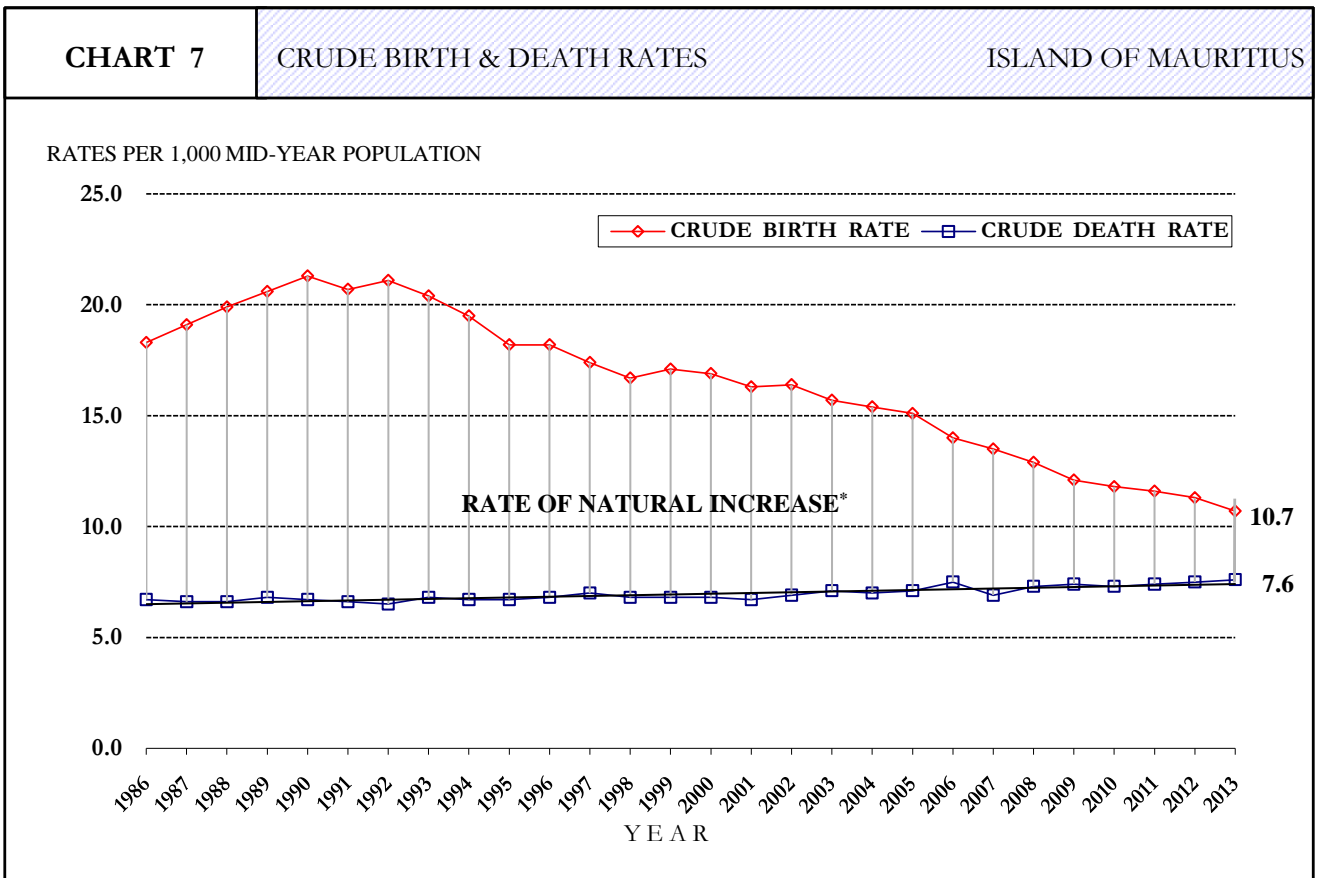

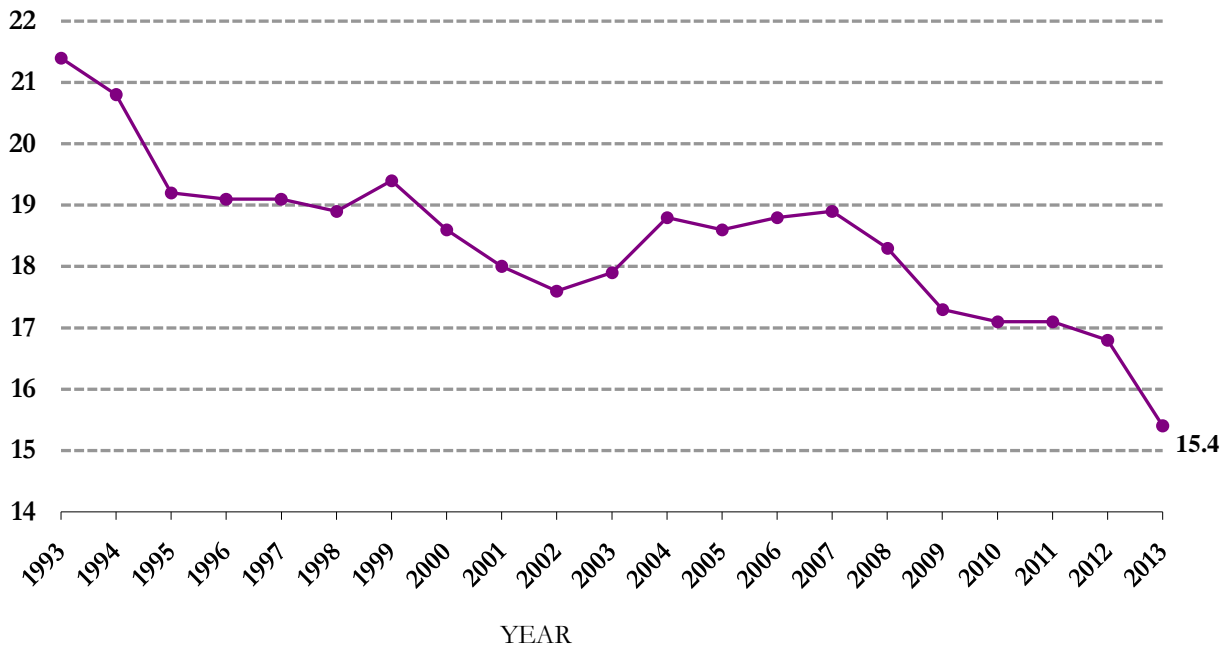

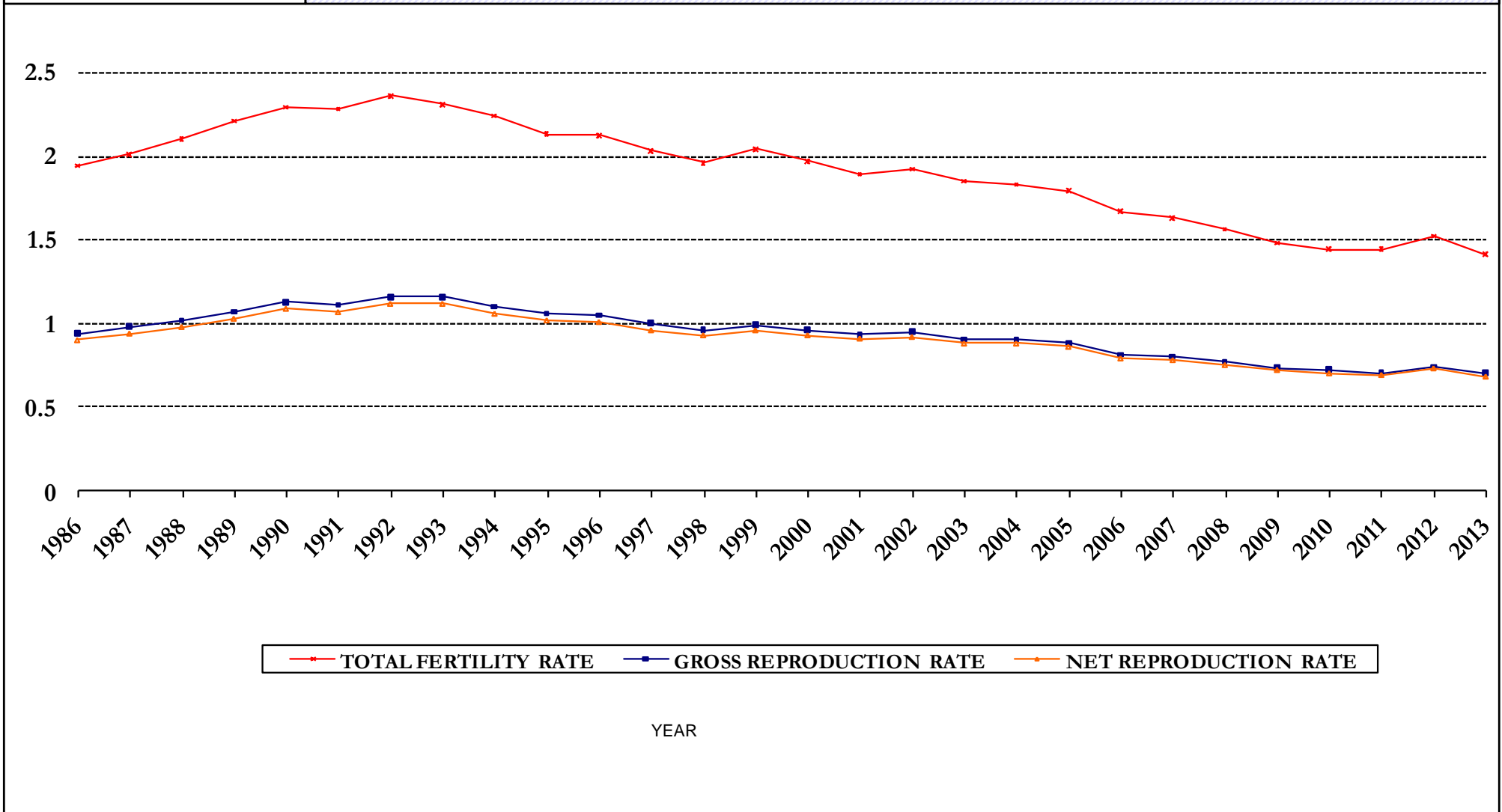

ISLAND OF MAURITIUS



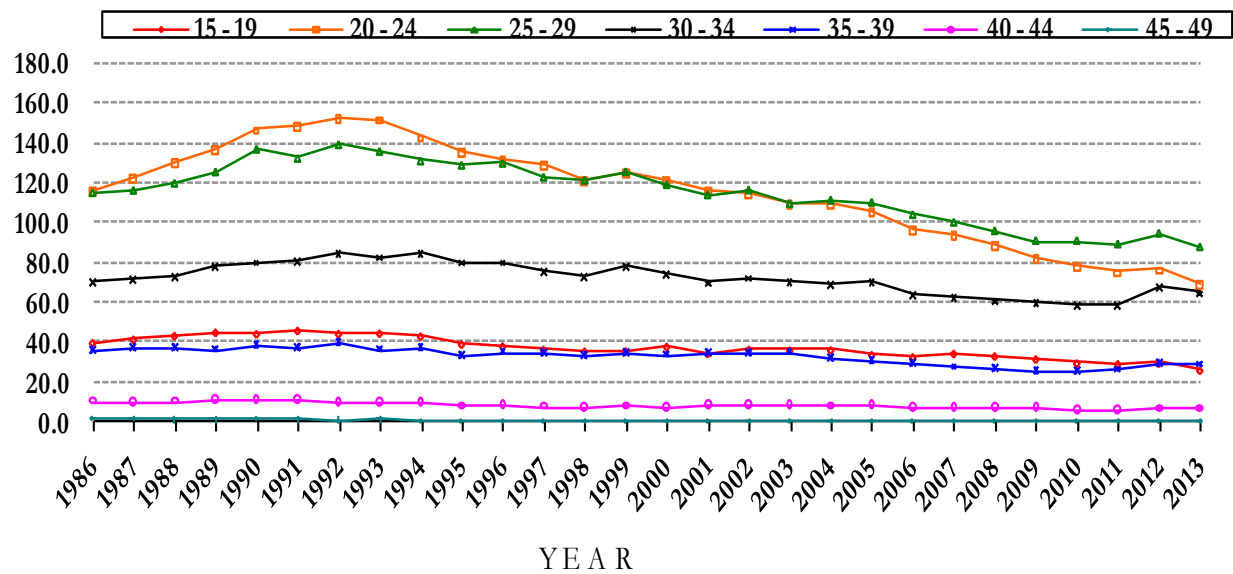

AGE OF MOTHER

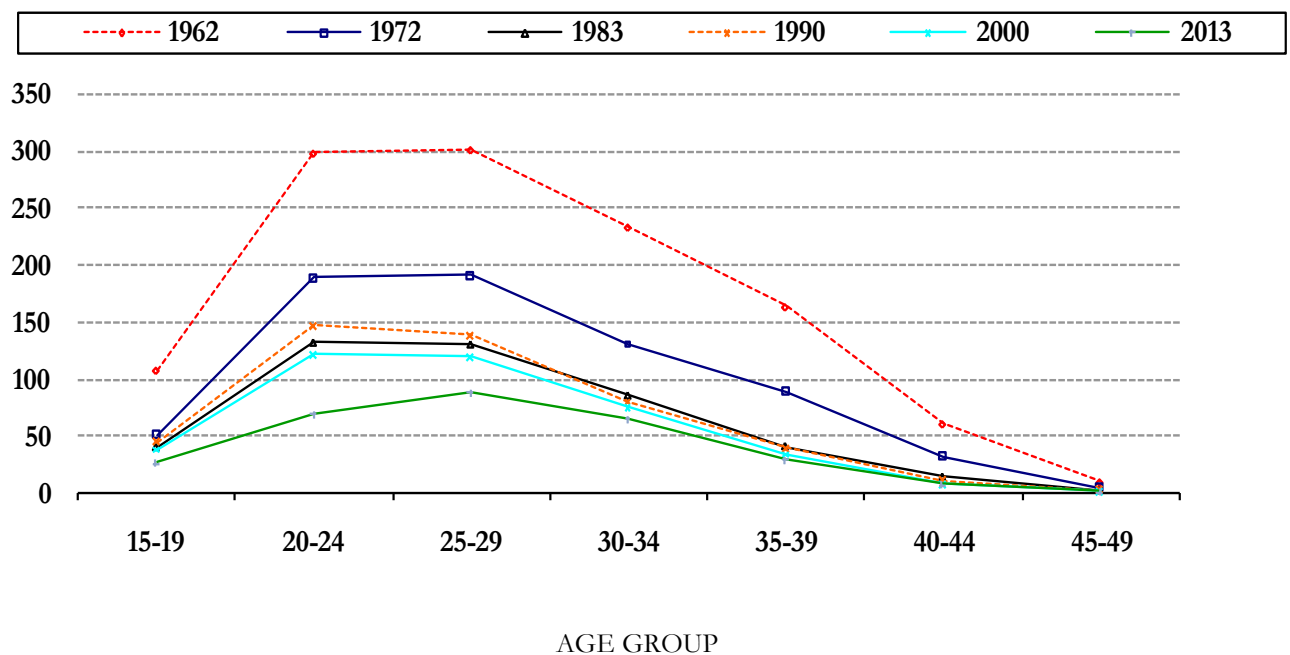

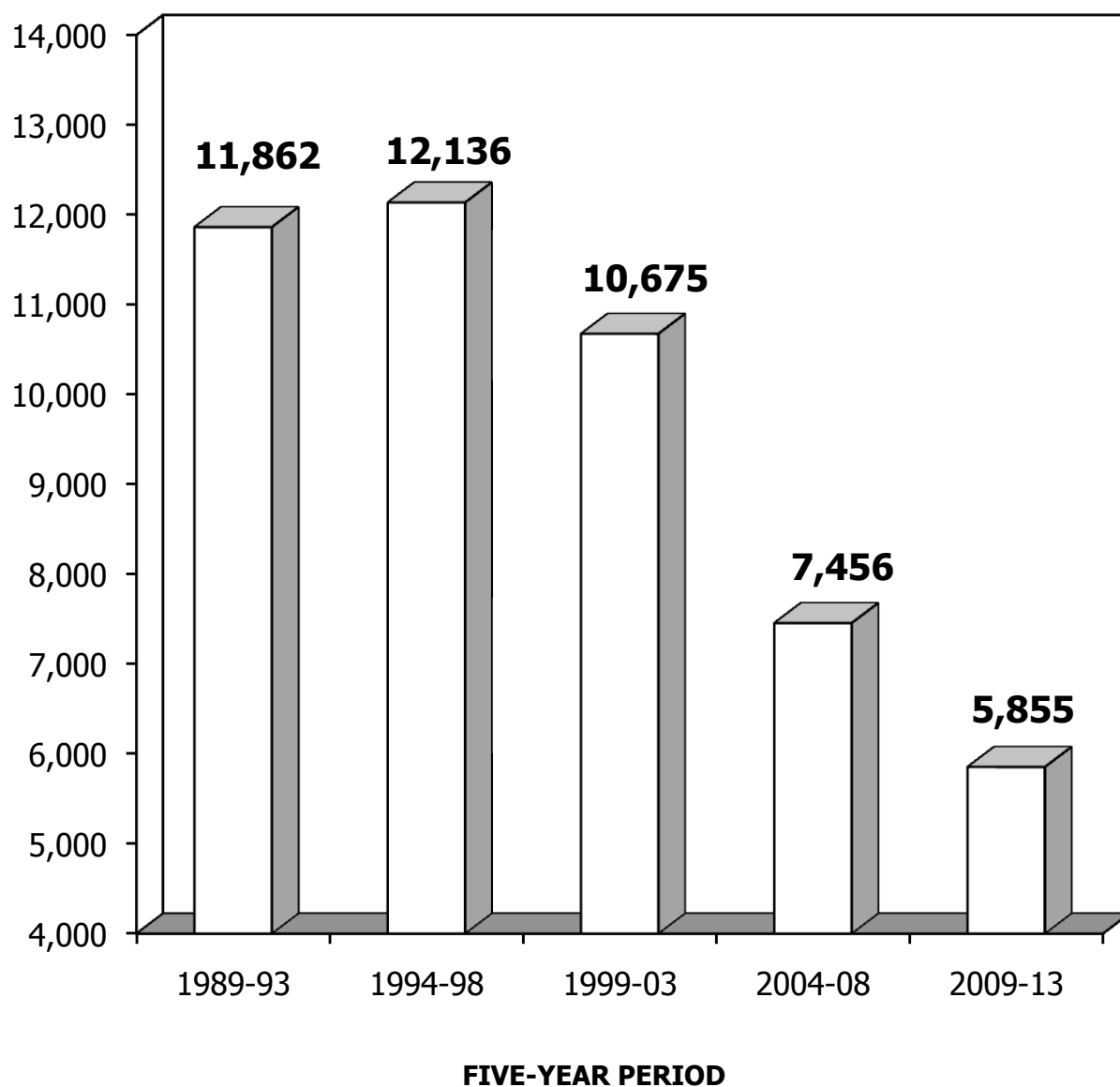

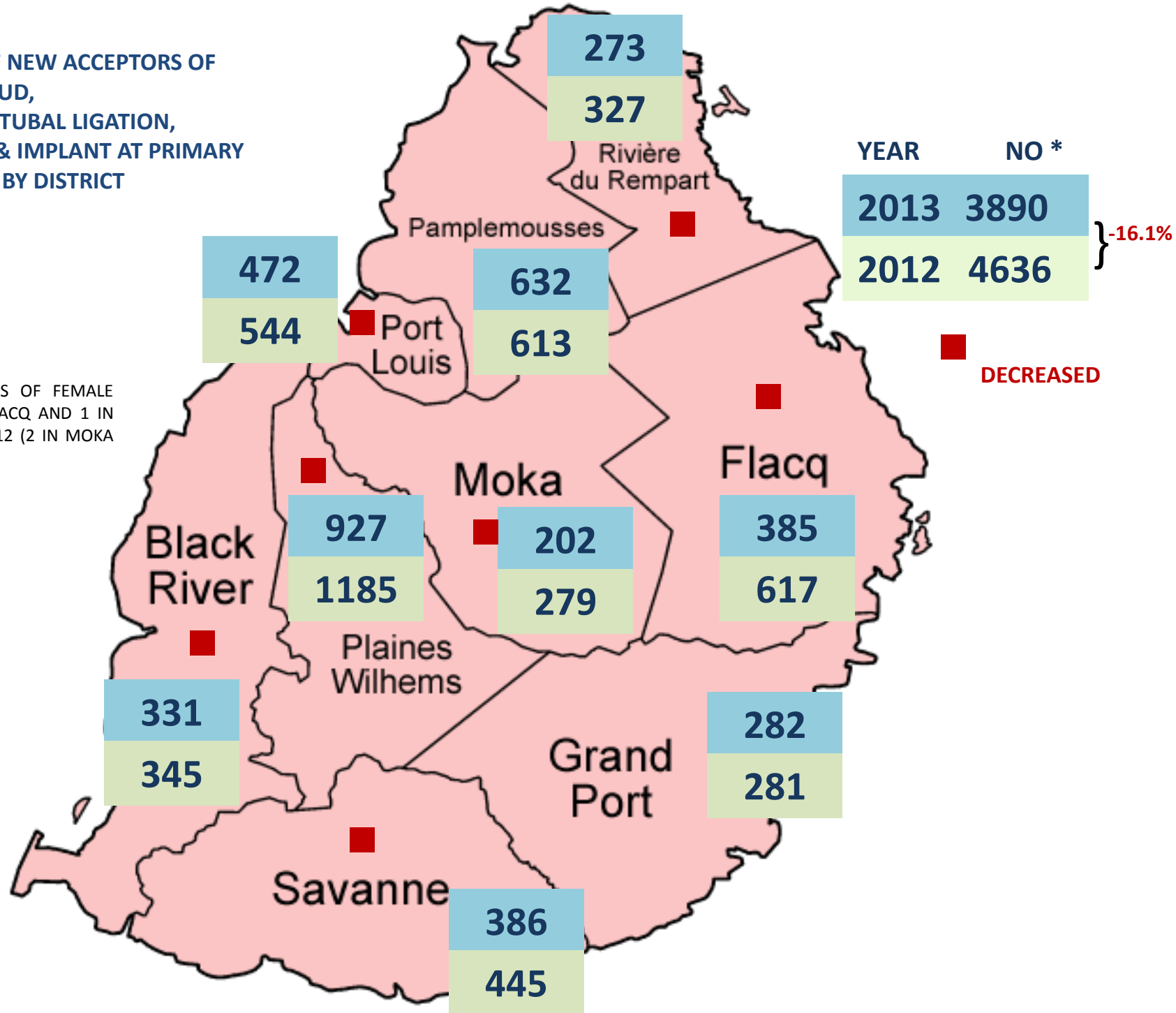

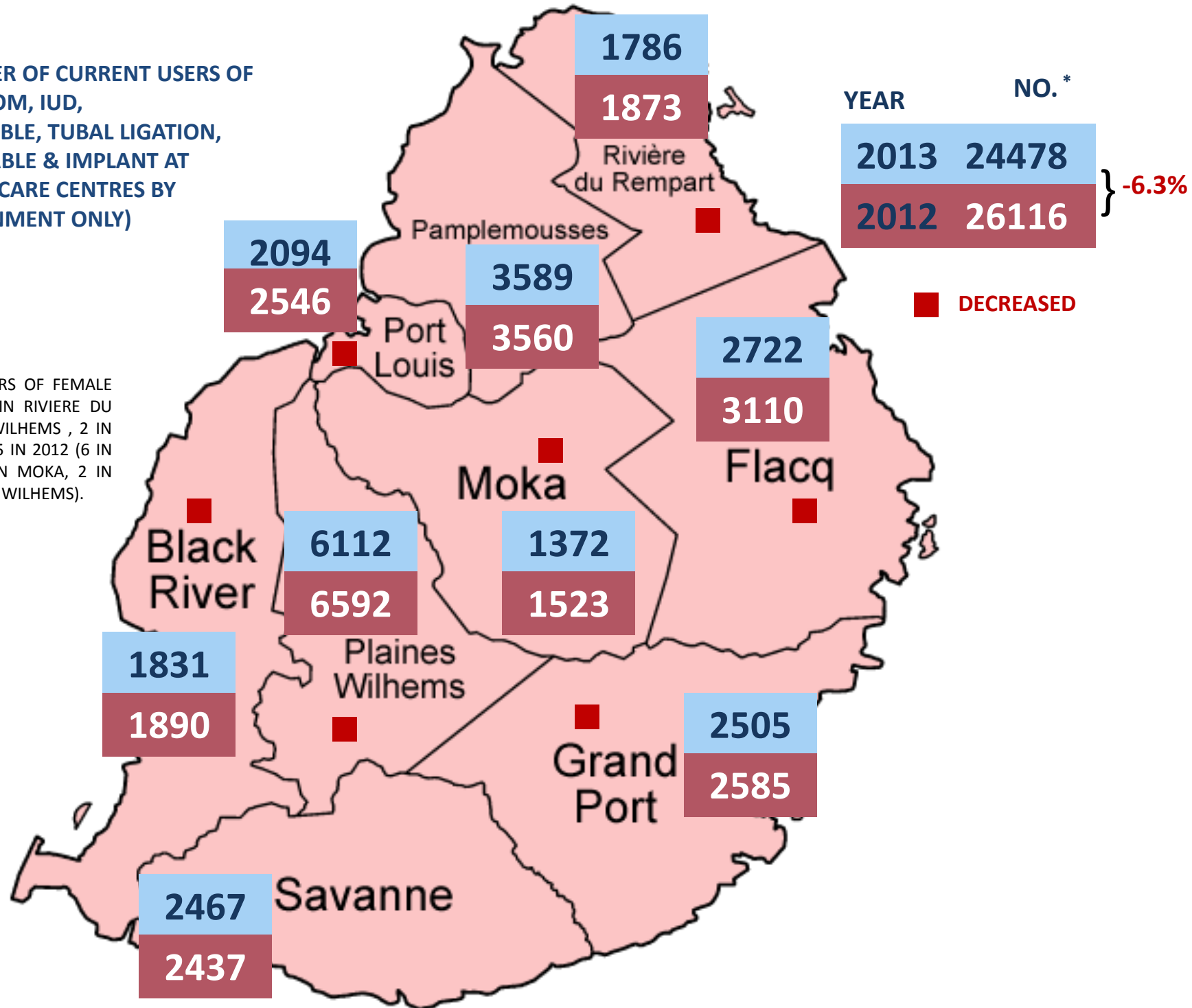

# Glossary

## ***Population***

Census	The total process of collecting, compiling and publishing data on the demographic, social and economic situation of all persons in a specified territory at a particular time. Decennial censuses are usually the norm.
De facto population	A population enumerated or estimated on the basis of those present at a particular time, including temporary visitors but excluding residents temporarily absent.
De jure population	A population enumerated or estimated on the basis of normal residence, excluding temporary visitors but including residents temporarily absent.
Density of population	A ratio of the number of people to the area of land that they occupy usually given as number of persons per square kilometer of area.
Natural increase	The excess of births over deaths.
Rate of natural increase	The difference between births and deaths occurring in a year per 1000 mid-year population. This rate is the difference between the 'crude birth rate' and the 'crude death rate'.
Population growth	The change in population size due to the three demographic processes, namely, births, deaths, and migration.
Doubling time	The number of years it would take for the population to double its current size at the current annual rate of growth.
Net external migration	The difference between international departure and arrivals of residents.

## ***Age structure***

Sex ratio	The number of males per 100 females in a population.
Total Dependency ratio	The combined child population (below 15 years) and older population (aged 60 years and above) per 1,000 population of the intermediate age (15-59 years).
Young-age dependency ratio (per 1000)	The ratio of the population below aged 15 years to that aged 15-59 years.
Old-age dependency ratio (per 1000)	The ratio of the population aged 60 years and above to that aged 15-59 years.
Median age	The age that divides a population into numerically two equal groups; one which is younger and the other which is older.
Population pyramid	A graphic that portrays the age-sex distribution of the population.

## ***Fertility***

Crude birth rate	The number of live births occurring in a year per thousand estimated mid-year population.
Fertility	The childbearing performance of individuals, couples, groups or populations. It is contrasted with FECUNDITY, the theoretical capacity which may or may not lead to fertility.
General fertility rate	The number of live births occurring in a year per thousand estimated mid-year female population in their childbearing age (15-49 years).
Age-specific fertility rate	The number of live births occurring to women of a particular age or age group per year, normally expressed per 1,000 women. Five-year age groups from 15-19 to 45-49 are most commonly used.
Total fertility rate	The average number of <i>children</i> born to a woman assuming that she survives to the end of her childbearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of age-specific fertility rates.
Gross reproduction rate	The average number of <i>daughters</i> born to a woman assuming that she survives to the end of her childbearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of <i>age-specific fertility rates</i> . This is similar to the total fertility rate except that the gross reproduction rate counts only daughters.
Net Reproduction Rate	The average number of <i>daughters</i> that would be born to a woman during her lifetime if she passed through all her childbearing years conforming to a fixed schedule of <i>age-specific fertility rates and age-specific mortality rates</i> . The net reproduction rate is closely related to gross reproduction rate employing the same data on fertility but also indicating the effects of mortality.
Replacement level fertility	A net reproduction rate of 1.0 denotes replacement level fertility; the women are having just enough daughters to "replace" themselves in the population.
Mean age of Childbearing	The average age of mothers at the time of birth
Live birth order	The ordinal number of a given live birth in relation to all previous live births of the same woman.

## ***Nuptiality***

Marriage rate	The annual number of men and women marrying per thousand mid-year population
Divorce rate	The annual number of men and women divorcing per thousand mid-year population.

## ***Mortality***

Crude death rate	The number of deaths in a year per 1,000 mid-year population.
Infant deaths	The number of deaths occurring to children less than one year of age (0 - 364 days).
Infant mortality rate	The number of infant deaths in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Child mortality rate	The number of deaths of children aged between one year and five years (1-4 years) in a year per 1,000 mid-year population aged between one year and five years (1-4 years) in the same year.
Under five mortality rate	The number of deaths of children aged under five years (0-4 years) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Still birth	The expulsion or extraction from the mother of a dead foetus after the time at which it would normally be presumed capable of independent extra uterine existence. This is taken to be after 28 weeks duration of pregnancy.
Still birth rate	The number of still births in a year per 1,000 total births (live births and still births).
Early neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants under one week (0-6 days) of age in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Late neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged between one week and four weeks (7-27 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged under four weeks (0-27 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Post neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged between four weeks and one year (28-364 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Perinatal mortality rate	The sum of the number of deaths of children aged under 7 days and the number of still births in a year per 1,000 total births (live births and still births) in the same year.
Maternal mortality	Mortality from causes connected with pregnancy, labour or the puerperium (lying-in period).
Maternal mortality rate	Number of deaths connected with pregnancy, labour or the puerperium divided by the number of live births and expressed per 1000 or 100,000.
Life expectancy at birth	The average number of years a newborn can expect to live based on the mortality conditions at the time.

## ***Family Planning Clients & Activities***

New acceptor	Someone who accepts a contraceptive method for the first time from a provider of a family planning programme.
Current User	A new acceptor who continues with the same or different method of contraception and pays regular return visits to the family planning service point to receive services and supplies.
Drop out	A current user who does not show up at scheduled appointment or thereafter within a defined period (according to the contraceptive method) for services and contraceptive resupplies at a family planning service point.
Drop out returnee	A client who starts receiving again the services and supplies available at the family planning service point after temporarily failing to pay return visits at the service point.
Canvassing	The purpose of canvassing is to seek potential clients who will benefit from information and services at a family planning service point.
Follow-Up	The purpose of follow ups is to remind clients that they have missed a scheduled appointment and to encourage them to make a return visit to the family planning service point.
Session	Field visits made by community health worker for canvassing and follow-ups.

## ***Organisations and Acronyms***

ACTION FAMILIALE (A.F.)	Action Familiale, a non-governmental organisation, was established in 1963 at the initiative of Msgr J. Margeot, then Vicar General of the Mauritian Catholic Diocese. Besides, promoting only sympto-thermal, which is a natural family planning method, Action Familiale provides a wide range of services which includes counselling services to couples.
MAURITIUS FAMILY PLANNING & WELFARE ASSOCIATION (MFPWA)	The MFPWA, a non-governmental organisation, was set up in 1957 by some volunteers who believed that the rampant population growth rate would hinder economic development in Mauritius. The MFPWA promotes modern methods of contraception and is involved in many family planning related activities.
MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH/ FAMILY PLANNING (MCH/FP)	The Ministry of Health and Quality of Life administers the Maternal and Child Health/Family Planning Programme which promotes reproductive health. The Family Planning Programme was integrated with the Maternal and Child Health Services in 1972.
