Statistics on HIV/AIDS (as at end of December 2023)


• NEW CASES

In 2023, the Virology Laboratory Services of the Ministry of Health and Wellness registered a total of 382 new cases of HIV/AIDS among the Mauritian population, among whom 36.6% were females. The number of monthly new cases of HIV reported during 2023 is given in the table below.

• MONTHLY AVERAGE

The monthly average of new cases in 2023 stood at 32. The monthly average number of new cases registered between 2014 and 2022 and computed over a 3-year period is depicted in the Chart below.



• TESTS

HIV tests carried out by the Virology Laboratory Services of the Ministry of Health and Wellness and positivity rates up to 2023 are as follows:

During the Covid-19 pandemic, the number of HIV laboratory tests witnessed a decrease from 96,713 in 2019 to 80,370 and 78,667 in 2020 and 2021 respectively. However, the number of tests gradually increased to 94,897 in 2022 and 98,049 in 2023. The positivity rate which was 0.44% equally in 2021 and 2022 decreased to 0.41% in 2023. The number of HIV Rapid Diagnostic Tests also witnessed an increase during the period 2021-2023, whereby it has increased to 38,970 in 2023 from 33,417 in 2022 and 22,677 in 2021.

• DISTRIBUTION OF NEW CASES OF HIV/AIDS AMONG MAURITIANS BY AGE-GROUP

39.3% of the new cases of HIV among Mauritians in 2023 were among those aged between 25-39 years followed by those in the age group 40-54 years with 27.2%. A breakdown by age group since 2013 is provided in the table below. Beside the 2 cases of mother-to-child transmission registered in 2023, no new case has been reported in the age group below 15 years.

• YEARLY NUMBER OF CASES

The first case of HIV/AIDS in the Republic of Mauritius was notified in October 1987. During the period 1987-2009, 4,396 new cases were registered with 4,219 cases among Mauritians. The yearly number of cases recorded since 2010 is given in the table that follows.

The decrease noted in the yearly number of new cases from 374 in 2019 to 319 in 2020 and 331 in 2021 is explained mainly by the decrease in the number of tests in these 2 years. However, following the increase in the number of tests in 2022, the number of newly detected cases among Mauritians has gone up to 386. In 2023, a slight decrease (1.0%) was noted with 382 new cases. The cumulative total (Mauritians only) since October 1987 to end of 2023 stood at 9,213 in the Republic of Mauritius.

• CASES AMONG INTRAVENOUS DRUG USERS (IDUs)

During the period 2017-2020, the number of HIV/AIDS cases detected among the IDUs had continuously decreased from 142 in 2017 to reach 70 in 2020. However, as depicted in the chart below, 109 such cases have been reported in 2023 compared to 77 in 2022; this represents an increase of 42%. The low numbers in the period 2020-2021 are probably due to the limited number of persons screened for HIV during the COVID 19 pandemic.
