A SUMMARY ON THE DEMOGRAPHIC AND FAMILY PLANNING STATISTICS

A summary of the statistics presented in the 2024 Family Planning and Demographic Yearbook is given in this section. The 2024 Yearbook is the fiftieth volume and provides statistics for Island of Mauritius and Island of Rodrigues on demography as well as on family planning for the government and the two non-governmental organisations, namely Mauritius Family Planning and Welfare Association and Action Familiale. The tables and charts in this volume have been grouped under the following headings: population, vital statistics, and family planning.

ISLAND OF MAURITIUS

CENSUS

The last two population censuses have been carried out in July 2011 and 2022, and the de jure¹ counts revealed that there were 1,196,383 inhabitants in 2011 and 1,189,493 inhabitants in 2022. The population density has decreased from 642 inhabitants per square kilometre in 2011 to 637 in 2022 (Table A.1). Moreover, it is noted that the average annual population growth rate has decreased from 0.42% for the intercensal period 2000-2011 to -0.05 % for the intercensal period 2011-2022.

POPULATION SIZE², GROWTH AND DISTRIBUTION

The estimated resident population was 1,201,245 as at 1st July 2024, thus showing a decrease of -0.26% since 1st July 2023 (Table A.4). Moreover, the estimated mid-year population in 2024 shows that there were more females than males: 606,350 females and 594,895 males.

In 2024, an estimate of 40.9% of the population lived in urban areas, and 59.1% lived in rural areas.

SEX RATIO

The sex ratio is a measure used to describe the balance between males and females in a population. In 2024, the sex ratio of the total population was 98.1 males per 100 females.


Due to the ‘female survival advantage’ in life expectancy, there are more females in the older age groups than in the younger age groups, and the gap increases with age. For instance, in 2024, there were 81.4 men per 100 women in the age group 60 and above and 55.3 men per 100 women in the age group 80 and above (*Chart 4*).

CHANGING AGE STRUCTURE

The population of Mauritius is growing older due to sustained low fertility level and increasing life expectancy, which in turn is resulting to lower proportion of children and higher proportion of elders in the population. The ageing index shows that there were about 135 older persons aged 60 years and above for every 100 children younger than 15 years old in 2024. Hence, Mauritius is witnessing a change in its age structure.

The share of the population aged 60 years and above in the total mid-year population has increased from 9.1% in 2000 to 21.0% in 2024, and it is projected³ to increase to 27.8% in 2044 and 33.7% in 2064 (*Chart 11*).


NUMBER AND PROPORTION OF PERSONS AGED 60 YEARS AND ABOVE IN 2024, 2044 AND 2064

Conversely, the share of the population aged 0-14 years in the total mid-year population has decreased from 25.0% in 2000 to 15.6% in 2024, and it is projected to decrease to 14.1% in 2044 and 12.9% in 2064. It is also noted that the share of the population aged 15-59 years has decreased (from 65.8% of the total mid-year population in 2000 to 63.5% in 2024), and it is projected to decrease to 58.1% in 2044 and 53.4% in 2064.

Changes in the age structure are also reflected in the median age of the population; 50% of the population is older than this age and 50% is younger. The median age of the population has increased from 29.4 years in 2000 to 38.8 years in 2024, and it is projected to increase to 44.8 years in 2044 and 47.7 years in 2064.



Mauritius is also witnessing a progressive ageing of its older population. The share of persons aged 80 years or older in the population aged 60 years and above is projected to increase from 10.8% in 2024 to 19.5% in 2064 (Chart 12). In other words, approximately 1 in 10 persons aged 60 years and above was 80 years or older in 2024, and this ratio is projected to be approximately 1 in 5 in 2064.

Population pyramids are useful in examining the age-sex structure of a population. The juxtaposed population pyramids for year 2024 and 2064 show that due to the projected rise in the number and proportion of old people in the population, the apex of the 2064 pyramid is broader than that of the 2024 pyramid (Chart 9). Moreover, based on the projected changes in the age structure, there will be an increasingly demand for healthcare services for the older persons.

Another ramification of the changes in the age distribution is that the total dependency ratio will continue to increase. The total dependency ratio compares the number of dependents (children aged 0-14 years and older persons aged 60 years and above) to the number of persons of working age (i.e. 15-59 years); a higher ratio indicates a higher burden on the working age population. The total dependency ratio has increased from 519.2 dependents per 1000 persons of working age in 2000 to 575.9 in 2024, and it is projected to increase to 719.8 in 2044 and 873.8 in 2064 (Table A.11).

WOMEN IN THE REPRODUCTIVE AGE GROUP (15-49 YEARS)

The number and proportion of women in the reproductive age group (15-49 years) are important demographic factors to consider in a sexual and reproductive health (including family planning) programme. The share of women in the reproductive age group (15-49 years) in the total mid-year female population was 49.1% in 2024, and it is projected to decrease to 42.5% in 2044 and 38.6% in 2064 (Chart 13).

LIFE EXPECTANCY

Life expectancy at birth has improved considerably and is expected to improve further over the years. It increased from 69.3 years in 1989-1991 to 73.8 years in 2022-2024 (Table A.7). Likewise, female life expectancy at birth increased from 73.4 years in 1989-1991 to 77.4 years in 2022-2024 and male life expectancy at birth increased from 65.6 years in 1989-1991 to 70.3 years in 2022-2024.

WOMEN ARE LIVING LONGER THAN MEN

Life expectancy at birth is higher for females than for males but the gap between male and female life expectancy at birth is narrowing. The above-mentioned figures show that a girl born in 1989-1991 could expect to live 7.8 years longer than a boy born in the same period, and for a girl born in 2022-2024, she could expect to live 7.1 years longer.

Life expectancy at age 60 for the total population was 20.4 years in 2022-2024, and women aged 60 years in 2022-2024 could expect to live an additional 22.3 years, compared with 18.4 years for men aged 60 years in the same period.

VITAL STATISTICS

The country has recorded more deaths than births; hence, indicating a slightly negative natural change of the population. In 2024, there were 12,088 live births and 12,164 deaths. Moreover, it is noted that there were 9 less live births and 615 more deaths in 2024 than in 2023 (Table B.2).

The crude birth rate has increased from 9.9 births per 1,000 mid-year population in 2015 to 10.1 in 2024, and the crude death rate has increased from 7.8 deaths per 1,000 mid-year population in 2015 to 10.1 in 2024. Moreover, it is noted that the crude birth rate for the five-year period has declined, from 10.1 in 2015-2019 to 9.9 in 2020-2024. As for the crude death rate, it has fluctuated between 7.8 and 10.7 during the period of 2015-2024.

There were 173 infant deaths (deaths under 1 year of age) that were registered in 2024. The infant mortality rate, which is the number of infant deaths in a year per 1,000 live births, is often used as a proxy measure of the overall health of the population. The infant mortality rate has increased from 13.7 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2015 to 14.3 in 2024, thus showing an increase of 4.4%. However, it is to be noted that the infant mortality rates for the five-year period have increased from 13.0 in 2015-2019 to 14.1 in 2020-2024.

Neonatal deaths (deaths of babies under 28 days of age) accounted for 74% of all infant deaths in 2024. The neonatal mortality rate, which is the number of neonatal deaths in a year per 1,000 live births, is a key outcome indicator for newborn care and directly reflects prenatal, intrapartum, and neonatal care. During the period of 2015-2024, the neonatal mortality rate has fluctuated between 7.6 and 10.6 deaths per 1,000 live births; in 2024, this rate was 10.6.

The number of still births was 87 in 2024 compared with 99 in 2023. The still birth rate, which is the number of still births in a year per 1,000 total births, has fluctuated between 7.1 and 10.7 during the period of 2015-2024. In 2024, the still birth rate was 7.1.

The under-five mortality rate is a leading indicator of child health and overall human development. The under-five mortality rate (deaths of children under five years of age per 1,000 live births) has decreased from 15.5 in 2015 to 15.3 in 2024, thus showing a decrease of 1.3%. However, the data shows that the under-five year mortality rate for the five-year period has increased, from 14.9 in 2015-2019 to 15.5 in 2020-2024.

There has been a marked improvement in maternal health in the twentieth century (*Table B.3*). For instance, the maternal mortality ratio declined from 0.70 maternal deaths per 1,000 live births in 1991 to 0.15 in 2000.

Factors such as strengthening and expanding the maternal and child health services, accessibility to family planning services, and contraceptive use have been associated with this declining trend.

In 2024, the maternal mortality ratio was 0.50 maternal deaths per 1,000 live births (or 50 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births). It is noted that the maternal mortality ratio (i.e. maternal deaths per 1,000 live births) has fluctuated between 0.25 and 0.79 during the ten-year period of 2015 to 2024. As part of the renewed commitment from the government to improve further the reproductive health indicators, policies and strategies have been formulated and are being implemented.

VITAL STATISTICS BY DISTRICT⁴

In 2024, the crude birth rates ranged from 8.9 in Plaines Wilhems and Moka to 13.3 in Port Louis (*Table B.4*). Three districts had higher rates (Port Louis, Pamplemousses and Black River) than the national level of 10.1.

In 2024, the crude death rates ranged from 8.8 in Flacq to 12.7 in Port Louis (*Table B.5*). Three districts had higher rates (Port Louis, Grand Port and Plaines Wilhems) than the national level of 10.1.

In 2024, the still birth rates ranged from 2.8 in Rivière du Rempart to 13.0 in Moka (*Table B.6*). Five districts had higher rates (Port Louis, Grand Port, Savanne, Moka and Black River) than the national level of 7.1.

In 2024, the infant mortality rates ranged from 4.0 in Moka to 20.3 in Port Louis (*Table B.7*). Five districts had higher rates (Port Louis, Pamplemousses, Grand Port, Plaines Wilhems and Black River) than the national level of 14.3.





FERTILITY

There has been a remarkable decline in fertility in the past few decades as measured by the total fertility rate. The total fertility rate is the average number of babies that a woman could expect to bear if current fertility rates prevail throughout her reproductive lifetime. The total fertility rate dropped sharply from 5.86 children per woman in 1962 to 3.42 in 1972 and continued to drop further thereafter.

The total fertility rate dropped below the replacement-level fertility of 2.10 children per woman—the level needed for a woman to replace herself and her partner—for the first time in the mid-1980s; however, it was not until 1997 onward that fertility has continuously been at sub-replacement level. In 2024, the total fertility rate was 1.41 children per woman compared with 1.35 in 2015, resulting in an increase of 4.4%.

In 2024, women in the age-groups 20-24 and 25-29 had lower fertility rates than women in the same age groups in 2015 (Table B.9), and the largest percentage decrease in fertility rates were among women aged 25-29 years (13.2%).

Early childbearing increases health risks for both mothers and their newborns. The fertility rate for women aged 15-19 years (adolescent fertility rate) has increased from 23.0 in 2015 to 25.0 in 2024, resulting in a rise of 8.7%. Even though progress has been made in reducing the fertility rate among adolescents, it is noted that 17 live births occurred to adolescents under 15 years of age in 2024.

In 2024, the age-specific fertility rates showed that women *aged 30-34 years* had the *highest* fertility rate (79.0) among all age groups, and that women *aged 25-29 years* (74.2) and women *aged 20-24 years* (53.2) had the *second* and *third* highest fertility rate respectively (Table B.9).

The median age of childbearing was 29.4 years in 2023 and 29.2 in 2024.

NUPTIALITY

Island of Mauritius

The 1962 and 1972 censuses showed that the proportion of currently married women in the age group 15-19 declined by slightly more than half, from 27.8% in 1962 to 12.5% in 1972 (*Table A.3*) whilst the average number of children per woman dropped from about 6 to 3 in the same period. Factors that have been linked to this sharp reduction in fertility between 1962 and 1972 include, among others, the postponement of marriage among younger women and contraceptive use. The 2022 census revealed that the proportions of currently married women in the age group 15-19 and 20-24 were 2.6% and 18.6% respectively.

There were 8,036 marriages that were registered in the Island of Mauritius in 2024, and the majority of brides (80.9%) and bridegrooms (82.2%) had never been married before. The crude marriage rate was 13.4 marriages per 1,000 mid-year population in 2024.

The median age of females and males at first marriage was 28.41 years and 31.39 years respectively in the Island of Mauritius in 2024. The median age at first marriage for females has increased by 0.15 years since 2023 and the median age at first marriage for males has increased by 0.22 years since 2023.

The data shows that 2,571 divorces and 3,013 divorces have been granted in 2023 and 2024 respectively in the Island of Mauritius. The crude divorce rate ranged between 2.5 to 5.0 during the period of 2010-2024 (*Chart 18*). In 2024, the crude divorce rate was 5.0 divorces per 1,000 mid-year population. Overall, 63% of all couples granted divorce in 2024 had at least one dependent child.

FAMILY PLANNING

Availability

Family planning helps save women's and children's lives by preventing unplanned pregnancies. Family planning services, including contraceptives, have been available to individuals and couples, free of user cost at government health service points since the late 60's.

The government family planning programme provides a wide range of short-term and long-term contraceptive methods⁵ through a network of health service points.

However, availability of family planning services in Mauritius dates back since 1957 when the non-governmental organization (NGO) Mauritius Family Planning and Welfare Association (MFPWA) was set up. The MFPWA family planning programme was then integrated with the government maternal and child health programme in 1972, and thereafter, MFPWA has continued to run a family planning clinic where contraceptive methods and counselling services are offered. Moreover, the NGO Action Familiale, which was established in 1963, has been promoting use of natural family planning methods and has been providing counselling services.

There is a concerted effort between the Government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale to provide family planning services. The national family planning programme has long shifted its focus from achieving demographic targets to improving the reproductive health of the population. However, since its inception, the guiding principle of the family planning programme has been that all couples and individuals have the basic right to decide freely and responsibly the number, spacing, and timing of their children.

Emergency contraceptive pills are also available. It should be pointed out that confidential counselling is an integral component of family planning services. In addition to being counseled on contraception, clients receive information on sexually transmitted infections as well as on preconception care and fertility awareness.

Family Planning Clients⁶


New Acceptors

In 2024, there were 2,979 new acceptors who were registered at the family planning service points of the government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale in the Island of Mauritius (*Table C.1*). This figure includes 657 new acceptors of tubal ligation reported at government hospitals. Three-month injectable was the most preferred method among the new acceptors accounting for 26.9%, followed by tubal ligation (22.1%), male condom (16.4%), sympto-thermal (16.1%), pill (12.9%), 1-month injectable (3.4%), implant (1.3%) and IUD (1.0%).

Current Users

As at 31st December 2024, there were 55,846 current users who were registered at the family planning service points of the government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale in the Island of Mauritius (*Table C.11*). This figure includes 14,165 current users of tubal ligation reported at government hospitals.

Sympto-thermal was the most preferred method among the current users accounting for 48.5%, followed by tubal ligation (26.0%), male condom (10.8%), 3-month injectable (5.5%), pill (4.3%), IUD (2.5%), implant (1.6%), and 1-month injectable (0.9%).

The yearly average number of current users for the five-year period has decreased from 60,521 in 2015-2019 to 56,341 in 2020-2024 (*Table C.10*), resulting in a decline of 6.9%.

⁶There are different types of family planning clients, and they include new acceptors and current users. A new acceptor is someone who accepts a contraceptive method for the first time from a provider of a family planning programme. A current user is someone who uses a method of contraception that has been obtained from the provider of the family planning programme. It should be pointed out that since the number of family planning clients of female condom in the government is small; it has been excluded in this section (In 2024: 1 new acceptor and 1 current user for Island of Mauritius).

Moreover, the programme-based statistics (for the government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale) shows that 18.7% of women aged 15-49 years were using a contraceptive method in 2024. However, the Contraceptive Prevalence Survey, which was carried out in 2014, showed that higher proportions of women aged 15-49 years (40.9%) and of currently married women aged 15-49 years (63.8%) were using a contraceptive method in the Island of Mauritius. This nationwide survey revealed that women in the reproductive age group 15-49 years were obtaining their contraceptive method either from programme sources (government and NGOs) or from non-programme sources (e.g. pills from pharmacies) or were using non-programme methods (such as withdrawal).

Accessibility and Attendance

Government family planning services are available through an extensive network of health service points, covering the whole island of Mauritius⁷ (*Appendix III*). As at 31st December 2024, there were 149 government family planning service points: 1 District Hospital; 2 Community Hospital; 12 Medi-Clinics; 18 Area Health Centres; 111 Community Health Centres; 2 Family Health Clinics; 2 Family Planning Clinics; and 1 Industrial Family Supply Centre. Hence, in relation to the population size, on average, for every 2,000 women in the reproductive age group (15-49 years), there was 1 government family planning service point.

In 2024, eight family planning clinics provided services after working hours, on Sundays and on public holidays.

There has been a decrease in the number of attendances at the government family planning service points: from 37,978 in 2023 to 33,783 in 2024.

⁷ For administrative purposes, five health regions have been established by the Ministry of Health and Wellness.

ISLAND OF RODRIGUES

VITAL STATISTICS

There were 764 live births and 342 deaths that were registered in 2024 (Table F.2). The crude birth rate was 17.3 births per 1,000 mid-year population and the crude death rate was 7.7 deaths per 1,000 mid-year population in 2024. Hence, the rate of natural increase was 9.6 in 2024.

In 2024, there were 11 infant deaths that were recorded and the infant mortality rate was 14.4 per 1,000 live births.

In 2024, there were 7 still births that were recorded and the still birth rate was 9.1 per 1,000 total births.

The total fertility rate has declined from 2.84 children per woman in 2000 to 2.50 in 2023 and in 2024, it was 2.35 (Table F.3). In 2024, the age-specific fertility rates showed that women *aged 30-34 years* had the *highest* fertility rate (120.1) among all age groups and that women *aged 25-29 years* (112.5) had the *second* highest fertility rate (Table F.4).

FAMILY PLANNING

Family Planning Clients⁸

New Acceptors

In 2024, there were 220 new acceptors who were registered at the family planning service points of the government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale in the Island of Rodrigues (Table F.5).

The most preferred method among the new acceptors was pill, accounting for 47.3%, followed by 3-month injectable (40.0%) and sympo-thermal (8.2%).

Current Users

As at 31st December 2024, there were 3,997 current users who were registered at the family planning service points of the government, MFPWA, and Action Familiale in the Island of Rodrigues (*Table F.6*). Sympto-thermal was the most preferred method among the current users accounting for 28.2%, followed by pill (27.6%), male condom (16.0%), 3-month injectable (13.6%), implant (6.7%), IUD (4.1%), and tubal ligation (2.9%) and 1-month injectable (1.6%)

Family Planning Service Points

In 2024, there were 14 government family planning service points in the Island of Rodrigues (*Table F.7*). Hence, in relation to the population size, on average, for every 812 women in the reproductive age group (15-49 years), there were 1 government family planning service point.

Attendance

In 2024, a total of 7,525 attendances were recorded at the government family planning service points.





CHART 1 POPULATION ENUMERATED AT CENSUSES, 1846-2022 ISLAND OF MAURITIUS







IN OLDER AGE GROUPS, WOMEN OUTNUMBER MEN

























AVERAGE NUMBER OF LIVE BIRTHS REGISTERED PER YEAR DURING THE FIVE-YEAR PERIOD

















(GOVERNMENT, MFPWA & ACTION FAMILIALE)











AT GOVERNMENT CLINICS, 2023 & 2024





MAP SHOWING THE NUMBER OF CURRENT USERS BY DISTRICT AT GOVERNMENT CLINICS, 2023 & 2024



Glossary

Population

Census	The total process of collecting, compiling and publishing data on the demographic, social and economic situation of all persons in a specified territory at a particular time. Decennial censuses are usually the norm.
De facto population	A population enumerated or estimated on the basis of those present at a particular time, including temporary visitors but excluding residents temporarily absent.
De jure population	A population enumerated or estimated on the basis of normal residence, excluding temporary visitors but including residents temporarily absent.
Density of population	A ratio of the number of people to the area of land that they occupy usually given as number of persons per square kilometer of area.
Natural increase	The excess of births over deaths.
Rate of natural increase	The difference between births and deaths occurring in a year per 1,000 mid-year population. This rate is the difference between the 'crude birth rate' and the 'crude death rate'.
Population growth	The change in population size due to the three demographic processes, namely births, deaths, and migration.
Net external migration	The difference between international departure and arrivals of residents.

Age structure

Sex ratio	The number of males per 100 females in a population.
Total dependency ratio	The combined child population (below 15 years) and older population (aged 60 years and above) per 1,000 population of working age (i.e. 15-59 years).
Young-age dependency ratio (per 1000)	The ratio of the number of persons aged less than 15 years to the number of persons of working age (i.e. 15-59 years old).
Old-age dependency ratio (per 1000)	The ratio of the number of persons aged 60 years and above to the number of persons of working age (i.e. 15-59 years old).
Median age	The age that divides a population in two parts of equal size: i.e., there are as many persons with ages above the median age as there are with ages below the median age.
Population pyramid	A graphic that portrays the age-sex distribution of the population.

Fertility

Crude birth rate	The number of live births registered in a year per thousand estimated mid-year population.
Fertility	The childbearing performance of individuals, couples, groups or populations. It is contrasted with FECUNDITY, the theoretical capacity which may or may not lead to fertility.
General fertility rate	The number of live births occurring in a year per thousand estimated mid-year female population in their childbearing age (15-49 years).
Age-specific fertility rate	The number of live births occurring to women of a specific age group per year, normally expressed per 1,000 women in the same age group. Five-year age groups from 15-19 to 45-49 are most commonly used.
Total fertility rate	The average number of <i>children</i> that would be born to a woman assuming that she survives to the end of her childbearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of age-specific fertility rates.
Gross reproduction rate	The average number of <i>daughters</i> that would be born to a woman assuming that she survives to the end of her childbearing age and is subjected to a fixed schedule of <i>age-specific fertility rates</i> . This is similar to the total fertility rate except that the gross reproduction rate counts only daughters.
Net Reproduction Rate	The average number of <i>daughters</i> that would be born to a woman during her lifetime if she passed through all her childbearing years conforming to a fixed schedule of <i>age-specific fertility rates and age-specific mortality rates</i> . The net reproduction rate is closely related to gross reproduction rate employing the same data on fertility but also indicating the effects of mortality.
Replacement level fertility	The level of fertility at which a population exactly replaces itself from one generation to the next and it is taken to be an average of 2.1 children per woman. Alternatively, a net reproduction rate of 1.0 denotes replacement level fertility; the women are having just enough daughters to "replace" themselves in the population.
Mean age of Childbearing	The average age of mothers at the time of birth.
Live birth order	The ordinal number of a given live birth in relation to all previous live births of the same woman.

Nuptiality

Marriage rate	The annual number of men and women marrying per thousand mid-year population.
Divorce rate	The annual number of men and women divorcing per thousand mid-year population.

Mortality

Crude death rate	The number of deaths in a year per thousand estimated mid-year population.
Infant deaths	The number of deaths occurring to children less than one year of age (0-364 days).
Infant mortality rate	The number of infant deaths in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Child mortality rate	The number of deaths of children aged between one year and five years (1-4 years) in a year per 1,000 mid-year population aged between one year and five years (1-4 years) in the same year.
Under five mortality rate	The number of deaths of children aged under five years (0-4 years) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Still birth	The expulsion or extraction from the mother of a dead foetus after the time at which it would normally be presumed capable of independent extra uterine existence. This is taken to be at or after 28 weeks duration of pregnancy.
Still birth rate	The number of still births in a year per 1,000 total births (live births and still births).
Early neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants under one week (0-6 days) of age in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Late neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged between one week and four weeks (7-27 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged under four weeks (0-27 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Post neonatal mortality rate	The number of deaths of infants aged between four weeks and one year (28-364 days) in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year.
Perinatal mortality rate	The sum of the number of deaths of children aged under 7 days and the number of still births in a year per 1,000 total births (live births and still births) in the same year.
Maternal mortality	Mortality from causes connected with pregnancy, labour or the purperium (lying-in period).
Maternal mortality ratio	Number of deaths connected with pregnancy, labour or the purperium divided by the number of live births and expressed per 1,000 or 100,000.
Life expectancy at birth	The average number of years a newborn can expect to live based on the mortality conditions at the time.

Family Planning Clients & Activities

New acceptor	Someone who accepts a contraceptive method for the first time from a provider of a family planning programme.
Current User	A new acceptor who continues with the same or different method of contraception and pays regular return visits to the family planning service point to receive services and supplies.
Drop out	A current user who does not show up at scheduled appointment or thereafter within a defined period (according to the contraceptive method) for services and contraceptive resupplies at a family planning service point.
Drop out returnee	A client who starts receiving again the services and supplies available at the family planning service point after temporarily failing to pay return visits at the service point.
Canvassing	The purpose of canvassing is to seek potential clients who will benefit from information and services at a family planning service point.
Follow-Up	The purpose of follow ups is to remind clients that they have missed a scheduled appointment and to encourage them to make a return visit to the family planning service point.
Session	Field visits made by community health worker for canvassing and follow-ups.

Organisations and Acronyms

ACTION FAMILIALE (A. F.)	Action Familiale, a non-governmental organisation, was established in 1963 at the initiative of Mgr J. Margeot, then Vicar General of the Mauritian Catholic Diocese. Besides, promoting sympto-thermal, which is a modern natural family planning method, Action Familiale provides a wide range of services which includes counselling services to couples and youth.
MAURITIUS FAMILY PLANNING & WELFARE ASSOCIATION (MFPWA)	The MFPWA, a non-governmental organisation, was set up in 1957 by some volunteers who believed that the rampant population growth rate would hinder social and economic development in Mauritius. The MFPWA promotes modern methods of contraception and is involved in many family planning, women empowerment and advocacy related activities.
MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH/ FAMILY PLANNING (MCH/FP)	The Ministry of Health and Wellness administers the Maternal and Child Health/Family Planning Programme which promotes reproductive health. The Family Planning Programme was integrated with the Maternal and Child Health Services in 1972. Family planning services are available, free of user cost, through a network of health service points.

Empowering young people to create the families they want in a fair and hopeful world



As fertility rates across the world drop to record lows, politicians and media pundits are increasingly sounding alarm bells, often sowing panic about “depopulation”, “population collapse” and even human “extinction”. Yet the latest *State of World Population* report reveals that the actual problem is not declining fertility rates – nor is it the current unprecedented 8 billion world population size. The real crisis is a lack of *reproductive agency*: Too many people simply aren’t able to fulfil their fertility aspirations.

Among the most affected are young people. They are the ones making these crucial and difficult choices as they embark on journeys to adulthood and beyond. They are also shouldering much of the blame for declining birth rates, with many assuming young people are choosing not to have children whether for their careers, sexual orientation or out of perceived “selfishness”. Yet a UNFPA and YouGov survey of more than 14,000 people across 14 countries showed that most respondents did want more children, but weren’t able to have them, largely because of major social, financial and health barriers.

Young people who are optimistic about the future are more likely to pursue the lives they want for themselves and their families. Yet most report worries and uncertainty about their futures – itself another obstacle to achieving desired fertility rates. A combination of climate disasters, economic instability and rising global conflicts mean many fear their world will be less hopeful than their parents’ was. It’s not uncommon for young people to feel cheated – to believe they have been robbed of their futures by policymakers impervious to their lived realities.

Leaders concerned about population trends should listen to young people's voices and recognize their legitimate concerns. They not only need conditions enabling them to make free, informed reproductive choices, but also hope for a future in which those choices are supported. As one youth activist told UNFPA, “Young people are not just thinking about their future children – they are thinking about the world those children will inherit”.

Fairness across generations is fundamental to sustainable development, well-being and peace. Fostering solidarity between generations and supporting the human rights of both current and future generations of younger and older people can ensure the health and dignity for all at every stage of life.
